The Horowitz Multiple Systemic Infectious Disease Syndrome Questionnaire (HMQ)

The HMQ, developed by Dr. Richard Horowitz, is a validated Lyme disease screening questionnaire that can be utilized by the provider to evaluate the probability of a patient having Lyme disease. Along with sensitive and specific laboratory testing through the Vibrant TickBorne Diseases Panel, the HMQ can help to facilitate the assessment of Lyme disease and associated tickborne illnesses.

*Vibrant criteria for detection of Lyme Disease has higher sensitivity and specificity than the two-tier testing by CDC criteria, as demonstrated by internal studies. The Vibrant Immunochip is made from recombinant proteins of several species of Borrelia Burgdorferi, and not just from B31 used by other western blot tests. Vibrant has the most comprehensive antibody tests for IgG and IgM antibodies (indirect) and DNA (direct) test for detection of Lyme and co-infections that, in most cases, can assist the clinician in assessing these situations and lead to the correct diagnosis.
